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Message from the ACCME President and CEO

A Resilient, Innovative, and Dedicated Community of Educators

As I reviewed this data, I reflected on the spirit, resilience, perseverance, and creativity of the accredited education community. Although facing unprecedented challenges, educators adapted rapidly and efficiently, offering critical training to help clinicians and teams respond to the public health crisis. Despite substantial economic losses and a large reduction in the number of available activities, accredited providers not only retained but increased engagement with physicians and other healthcare professionals. The number of learner

Almost half of all providers, representing all organization types, offered education addressing the pandemic; this education comprised more than 3 million learner interactions, illustrating the remarkable capacity of our community to be part of the solution.

I also recognize that the pandemic has taken a toll on our community. Many of you suffered personal illness and grieved the loss of loved ones and colleagues, while contending with enormous stress and change in work environments. As we pause and reflect on this painful time, I hope that you will take note of your ability to rise to the challenges we faced and that we continue to face. We leveraged teamwork to endure these difficult experiences and we will meet the upcoming challenges together with the same spirit of community.

As we emerge from the pandemic, accredited education will be an essential resource for physicians and teams. ACCME Data Report

Rising to the Challenge in Accredited Continuing Education – 2020 Executive Summary

Each year, accredited providers within the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME®) System submit data describing their accredited education activities and overall education programs. The ACCME aggregates this information to give a view of the year as well as long-range trends. The 2020 Data Report marks the 23rd year we have published this report as a service to our accredited education community and other healthcare stakeholders.

Key Takeaways-A Resilient, Responsive Community

Despite the unprecedented challenges created by the COVID-19 pandemic, accredited providers adapted nimbly, redesigning learning environments to offer critically needed skills and support to physicians and teams. Even with severe economic losses and a reduction in the number of activities, providers retained and even increased engagement by physicians and other healthcare professional learners. This was accomplished by rapidly shifting to online and virtual learning environments. The ability to be so responsive reflects on the strength and capacity of the accredited education community.

- Approximately 1,680 accredited education providers offered over 170,000 educational activities in 2020.
- This education comprised more than 1 million hours of instruction and over 45 million interactions with healthcare professionals.
- Approximately half of all providers, representing all organization types, offered education addressing the pandemic; this education comprised more than 3 million learner interactions.
- Since 2019, the number of learner interactions increased by 22%, while the number of educational events decreased by 9%, and hours of instruction decreased by 18%.
- The activity types that engaged the most learners shifted in 2020 from live courses and regularly scheduled series, the dominant activity types in preceding years, to online activities.
- Increasingly, providers are offering blended, new, or other approaches that do not fall
 into one of the established activity types. These are identified as *other*. While the
 number of activities reported as *other* is relatively small (628), this represents an
 increase from the 409 *other* activities reported in 2019.
- This is the third year in a row that other learner interactions have surpassed physician interactions. (Other learners include nonphysician healthcare professionals such as nurses and pharmacists.)

New This Year: Education Related to COVID-19

This data report includes a special section with analysis about the scope of accredited education activities related to the pandemic. Activities were identified as pertaining to the COVID-19 pandemic if they included the following keywords in the activity title: COVID, coronavirus, SARS-CoV-2, or pandemic. In 2020, accredited providers offered 6,417 activities addressing topics related to the COVID-19 pandemic, predominantly in Internet-based formats. Approximately half of providers offered education addressing topics related to COVID-19, comprising more than 3 million learner interactions.

New This Year: Expanded Data about Interprofessional Continuing Education

In support of our strategic goal to advance data systems, the Joint Accreditation Program and Activity Reporting System (JA-PARS) has been modified to enable jointly accredited providers to report learner data by more professions. In addition to the data about physicians, nurses, pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, optometrists, physician assistants (PAs), psychologists, and social workers, this data report includes, for the first time, the number of learner interactions with dentists and allied dental staff.

About the CME Provider Community

The ACCME Data Report 2020 features information on 1,680 accredited education providers in the ACCME System. This includes:

- ACCME-accredited providers: Organizations that offer continuing medical education (CME) primarily to national or international audiences.
- State-accredited providers: Organizations that offer CME primarily to learners from their state or contiguous states. These providers are accredited by <u>ACCME Recognized</u> <u>Accreditors</u> (state and territory medical societies).
- Jointly accredited providers: Organizations that focus on continuing education by and for healthcare teams. These providers are accredited by <u>Joint Accreditation for</u> <u>Interprofessional Continuing Education™</u>.

Accredited providers represent a range of organizations from large international institutions to small rural hospitals. Some specialize in local, community-based health issues, others focus on national and international health priorities, and others advance interprofessional continuing education (IPCE) and team-based care. The ACCME and Joint Accreditation accredit organizations within and outside the US, and this report includes data from providers located in other countries in addition to US provider data. The geographic distribution and diversity of accredited education providers means that physicians and teams have access to high-quality education where they live and work that addresses local, national, and international healthcare priorities.

Supplemental Data: This report features data aggregated from all the accredited providers in the ACCME System. We have also published a supplement which includes separate data sets about the accredited education offered by ACCME-accredited providers, state-accredited providers, and jointly accredited providers. Accredited Education Design and Evaluation

Accredited providers offer a diverse range of online and face-to-face activities to meet learners' educational needs and preferences. Accreditation requirements ensure that the education is based on practice-relevant, valid content that is independent of commercial interests.

Promoting Change: The Accreditation Criteria require providers to produce educational activities that are designed to create change and to analyze the changes that were achieved as a result of the activities. The report shows that 98% of accredited education activities are designed for changes in competence (teaching skills and strategies for translating new knowledge into action); 55% are designed to change performance (improving what healthcare professionals actually do in practice); and 28% are designed to change patient outcomes.

Investment in Accredited Education

Accredited providers reported approximately \$2.2 billion in investment in education from a variety of sources in 2020, a decrease of almost 27% from 2019. The majority of income (56%) came from participant registration fees. Commercial support accounted for 32%, advertising and exhibits for 10%, and private donations and government grants for the remainder. The vast majority of accredited education activities (91%) did not receive commercial support, accounting for 88% of learner interactions.

About the ACCME Data Report

Data Report Preparation: The aggregated information published in this annual report is based upon self-reporting by accredited providers and is available for audit by ACCME per requirements. The ACCME does not provide full verification of the accuracy of all reported information but does follow-up on outliers or major changes from previous years. We also investigate if it appears that providers have reported activity data that does not conform to the ACCME's definitions and reporting instructions.



CME Presented by Providers Accredited in the ACCME System Figure 1-2. Activities Addressing the COVID-19 Pandemic


Activity Counts by Activity Type Total activities = 6,417

Number of Providers by Organization Type Total organizations = 786




In 2020, accredited providers offered 6,417 activities addressing topics related to the COVID-19 pandemic. These activities represented a range of activity types, with Internet-based formats being the most popular. Almost half of all providers in the ACCME system offered education addressing topics related to COVID-19. All organization types developed education regarding this topic.

Total income for 2020 decreased by about 27% compared to 2019. While all income categories decreased, advertising and exhibits income showed the greatest percent change, down by 59%, and registration fees decreased by the greatest amount (~\$426 million). Although we did not ask providers for rationale behind the declines, we infer from the data and our discussions with providers that the decreases are due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Over 3 million learner interactions were reported for activities addressing the COVID-19 pandemic. The majority of these interactions occurred in Internet-based activities.




CME Presented by Providers Accredited in the ACCME System Figure 5. Activities, Hours, and Interactions—2005–2020



The accredited CME system saw a number of changes in 2020 due to the impact of COVID-19. While activities and hours of instruction decreased due to cancelled live activities, physician and other learner interactions both saw increases. Learners continued to engage in accredited education throughout the year, shifting their participation to online activities.


The breaks in the line for other learner interactions in 2018 indicates a change in data collection. In 2018, the launch of the Joint Accreditation Program and Activity Reporting System (JA-PARS) enabled jointly accredited providers to report program and activity data, including uni-professional and interprofessional continuing education (IPCE) activities, into a single, unified repository. This change accounts for the increase in other learner interactions.

CME Presented by Providers Accredited in the ACCME System Figure 6. Income—2020 Total income is \$2,243,627,062




In 2020, registration fees made up 56% of reported income. Commercial support accounted for 32%, advertising and exhibits income for 10%, government grants for 2%, and private donations for less than 1%.

There were 1,680 CME providers in 2020. Of these, 928 providers were state-accredited, 639 providers were ACCME-accredited, and 113 providers were accredited by Joint Accreditation for Interprofessional Continuing Education. State and territory medical societies are recognized as accreditors by the ACCME; they accredit organizations that offer CME primarily to learners from their state or contiguous states. More than 80% of state-accredited providers are hospital/healthcare delivery systems serving regional areas. The ACCME accredits organizations that offer CME primarily to national or international audiences. Most publishing/education companies have a national reach and are thus accredited by the ACCME. Schools of medicine that are accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) are eligible to be accredited by the ACCME or Joint Accreditation. Joint Accreditation for Interprofessional Continuing Education accredits organizations that focus on continuing education by and for healthcare teams.

The Accreditation Criteria require providers to produce educational activities that are designed to change learners' competence, performance, or patient outcomes. Providers are then required to analyze the changes that were achieved as a result of the activities.

Figure 8 illustrates the percentage of CME provided in 2020 that was designed and/or analyzed for changes in competence, performance, and/or patient outcomes.

CME Presented by Providers Accredited in the ACCME System Figure 9. Physician Learner Interactions by Activity Type—2019-2020



Fewer physicians participated in live activities, while more physicians chose to engage in online activities.

CME Presented by Providers Accredited in the ACCME System Figure 10. Other Learner Interactions by Activity Type—2019-2020



CME Presented by Providers Accredited in the ACCME System Figure 11. Activity Counts by Activity Type—2010-2020



CME Presented by Providers Accredited in the ACCME System Figure 12. Hours of Instruction—2010-2020


